



Responsible Citizenship Problems: Worksheet

Reading the problems below. What do you think a responsible citizen would do after thinking through the following issues?

1. Judy lives next door to Marisa, but she has not liked her for years. Judy doesn't think Marisa does her part to help keep the neighborhood clean. She does not clean up after her dog, litters the streets, and never puts the trash out for the garbage truck on pick-up day. Marisa never participates in the community meetings. She disrupts the peace and quiet of the neighborhood by hosting loud parties and letting her dog bark all through the night. When Marisa does yard work, she leaves garden tools and raked leaves on Judy's property when she is finished.

Do you think Judy would be a responsible citizen if she were to:

Gossip about Marisa to neighbors?

Report her to health authorities?

Leave her trash on Mary's property?

Not speak to her when she sees her outside?

Invite and encourage her to attend community meetings?

Speak to Marisa about her concerns?

The group asks Mrs. Harris to sit down and be quiet every time she speaks because she is taking up valuable time. They repeatedly remind her that she will not get her way.
