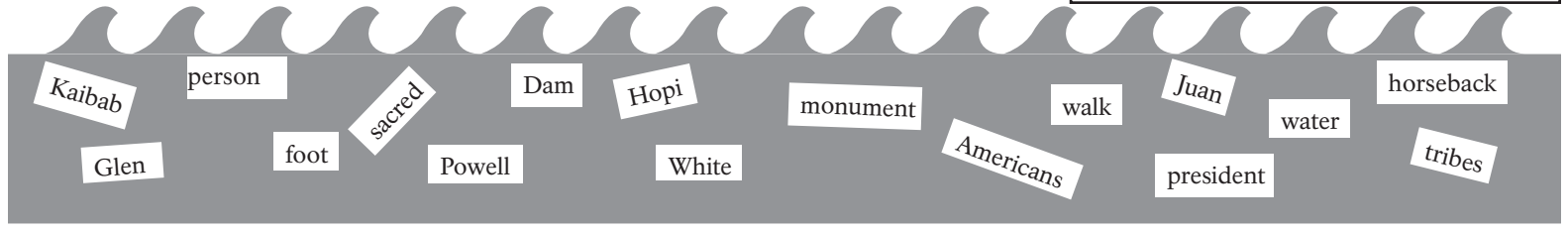


No one knows who the first \_\_\_\_\_<sup>1</sup> was that discovered Rainbow Bridge. Local Native \_\_\_\_\_<sup>2</sup> have known the bridge was here for a long time. 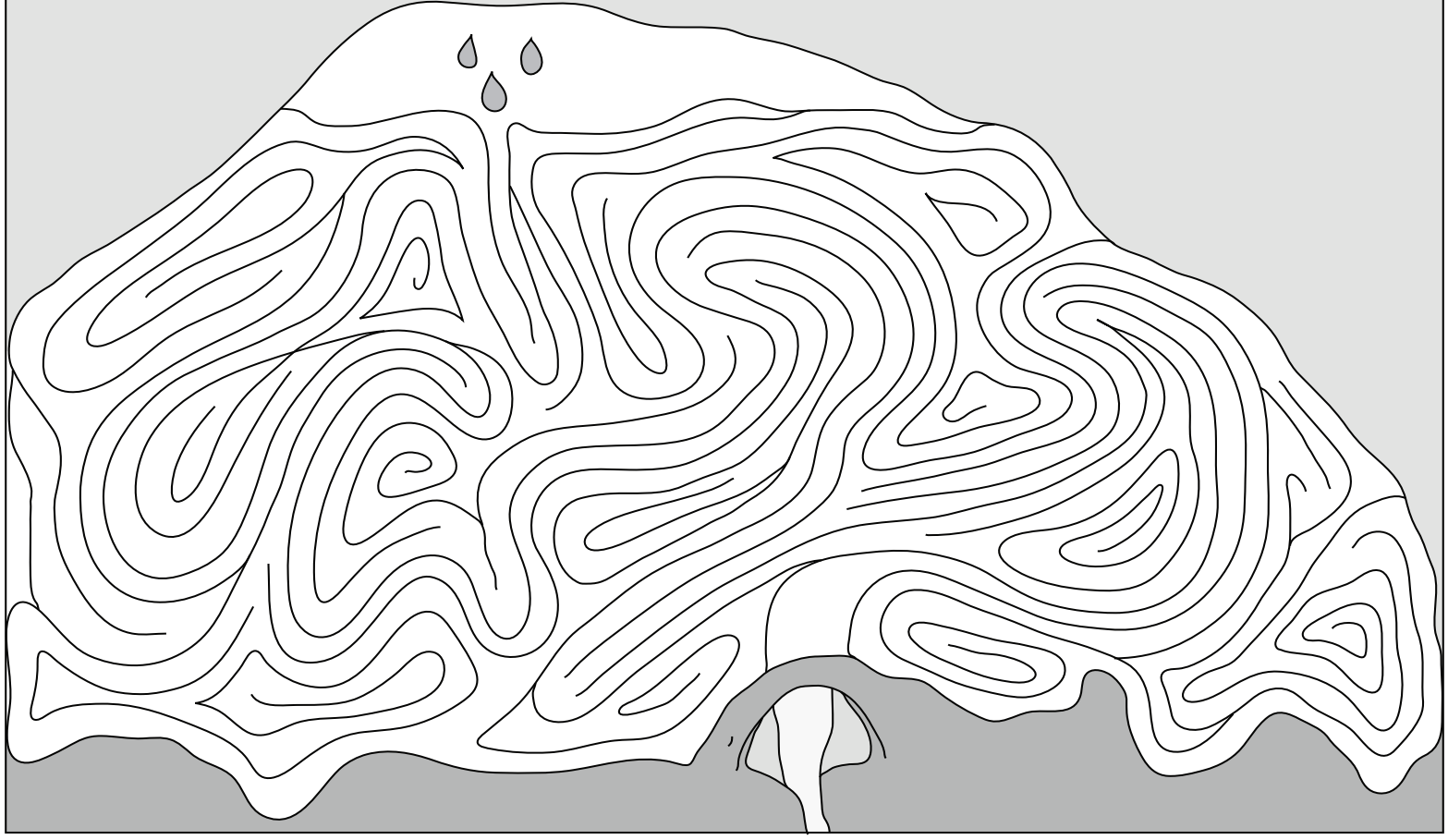

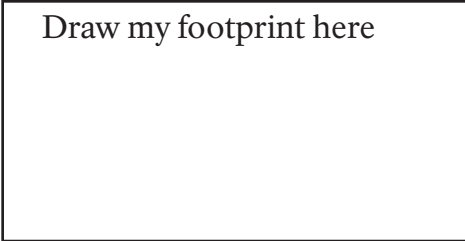
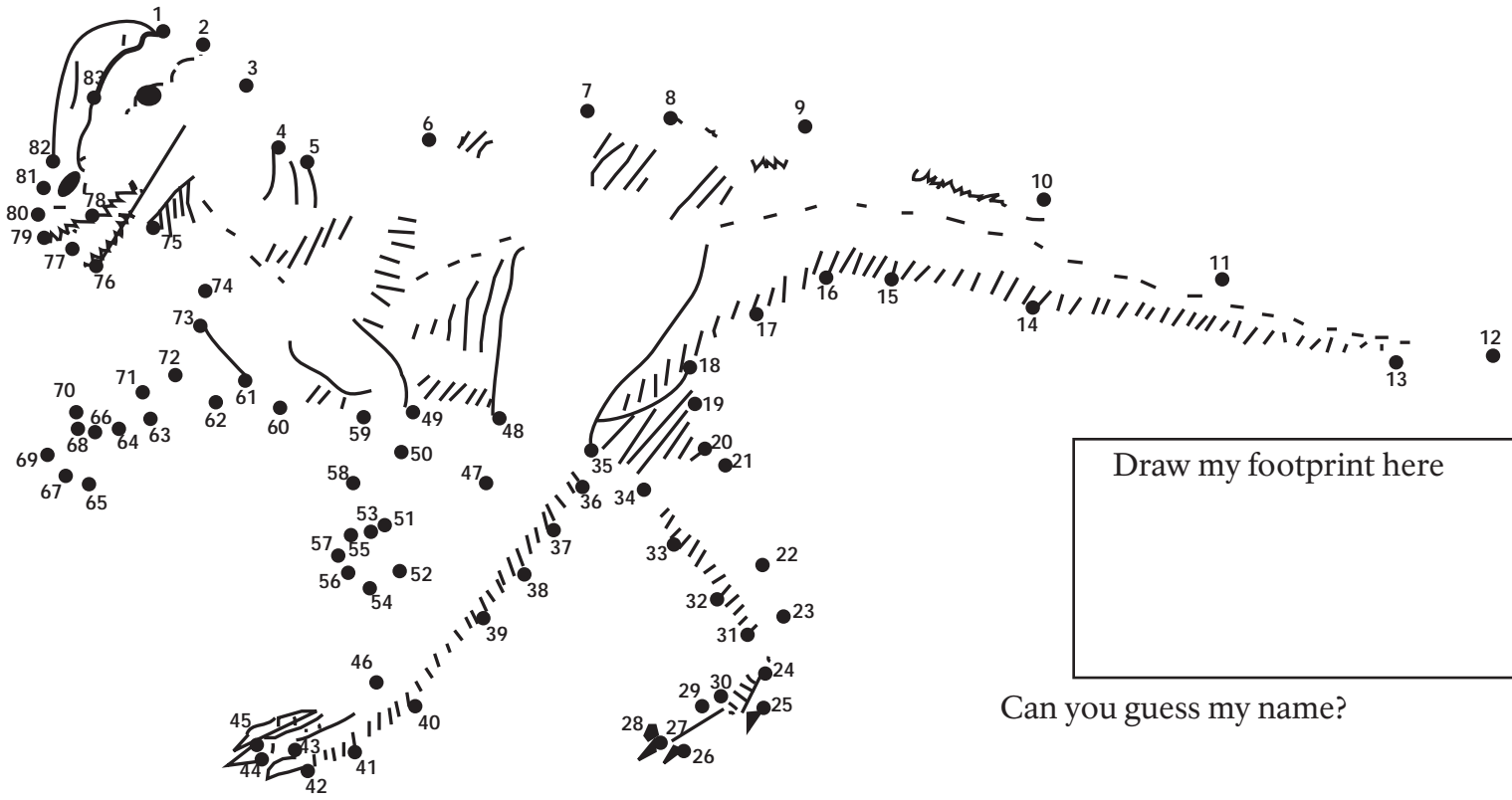

Water flowing down from Navajo Mountain carved out Rainbow Bridge. Can you help the raindrops find their way under Rainbow Bridge?



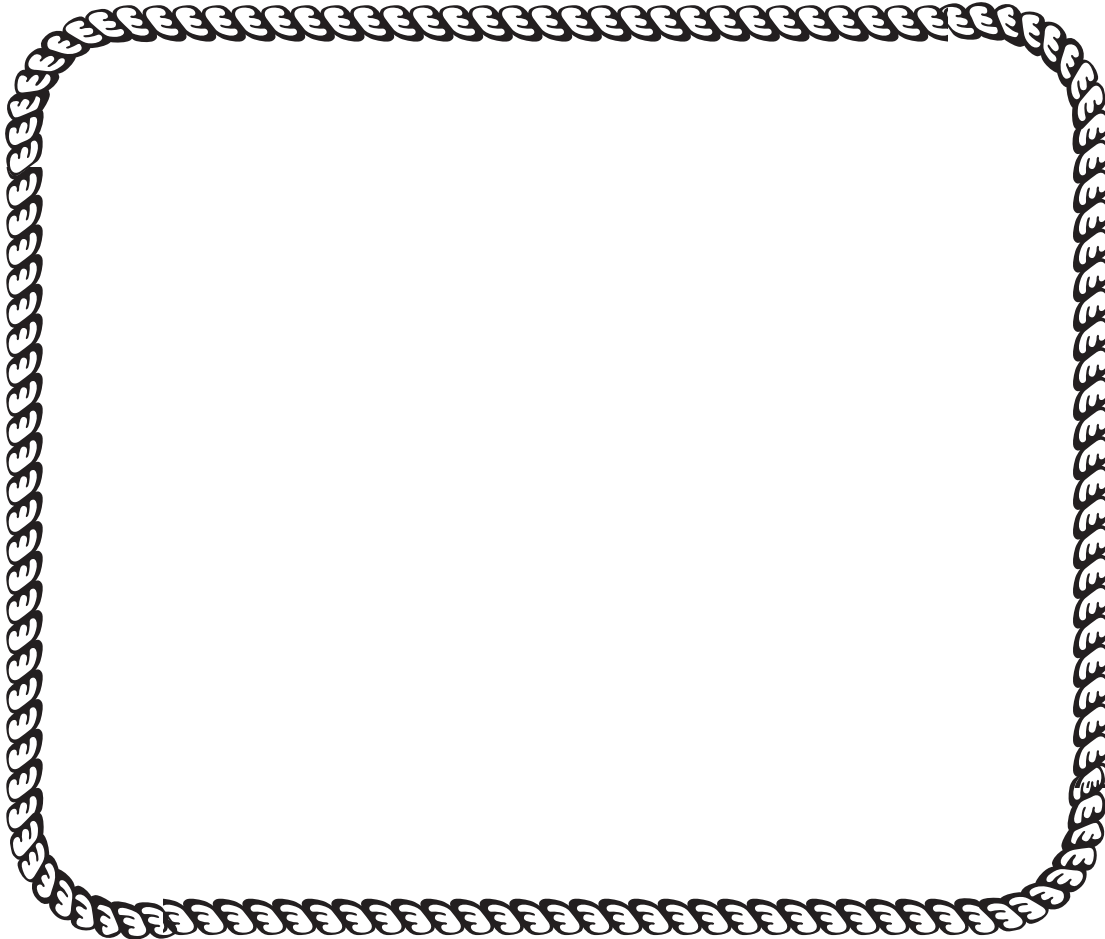
I left a footprint at the viewing area a long long time ago. Connect the dots to find out who I am.

Draw a picture of your favorite part of your trip to Rainbow Bridge.

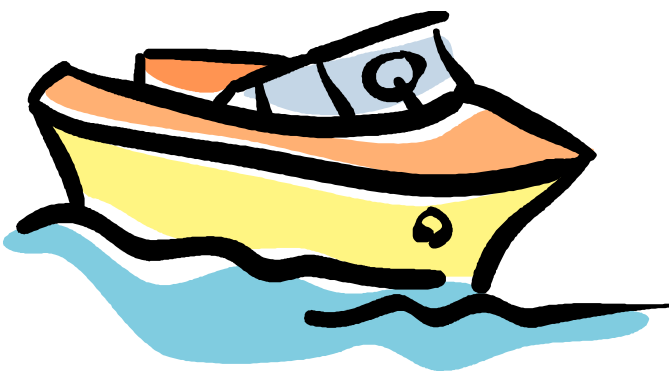
